## Thursday August 3<sup>rd</sup> - Archaeology Talk

#### A talk on the Archaeology of Ropley – 50,000BCE to 1800C

A talk of prehistoric gold, shrouded Saxon origins and Stuart controversy, will all be revealed

Ropley may not be at the centre of the history of Hampshire, let alone England, but this sleepy village hides ancient gold treasure.....

The talk will discuss Ropley's ancient history from Stone Age to the beginning of the Industrial Age seen through the finds and documents dug up by local historians and archaeologists. A landscape very different to ours now from the stone age rivers long since dried up, to Bronze age cemeteries and Brittonic and Roman farmsteads, to the beginning of Ropley – a Saxon settlement in a vast forest.

#### Researching Your Local and Family History

# 1.30pm – 2.30pm - Your Ancestors Uncovered - how to start your own family history research.

Fiona Ranger from the Hampshire Genealogy Society will give guidance on subjects that include certificates, censuses and parish registers, all very valuable resources for tracing your genealogy. The talk will end with how to record your research in a family tree.
